RESIGNATION OF COUNCILLOR SMITH AND CASUAL VACANCY

In December, **Louise Smith** decided to step down as a councillor. We would like to thank Louise for her time on the Parish Council representing residents and for her input in the pavilion development project as well as her participation on subcommittees.

In line with the Government Act 1972- Sections 87 and 89, Padbury Parish Council has given notice that a casual vacancy has arisen. The office of a Parish Councillor is to be co-opted as the next election is scheduled on 1st May.

PLANNING APPEAL FOR PROPOSED 79 HOUSES (LAND NORTH OF A413 PADBURY) AND INFORMAL HEARING UPDATE.

The developer filed its appeal papers just before Christmas, when most people's attention was elsewhere. Following representations by the Parish Council, a small extension to 17 January was granted. Hopefully you made your views known!

An Informal Hearing into the appeal will start on **4th March 2025** in the Jubilee Room at The Gateway, Gatehouse Road, Aylesbury, HP19 8FF commencing at 10.00am. The planning inspector is **A. Owen MA BA (Hons) MRTPI**. Residents are welcome to attend and may, at the Inspector's discretion, give their views.

The relevant appeal / planning application numbers are: 24/00092/REF Appeal (22/03695/AOP) Outline Planning Application.

GRAFFITI AT THE NEW INN BUS STOP

Unfortunately, just before Christmas, the New Inn bus stop was vandalised. The clerk managed to secure two quotes to clean the brickwork as soon as possible.

The cost in real terms equates to each household in the village paying over £1 from their Council Tax for this work.

PADBURY PLAY AREA UPDATE

We are pleased to announce that the work to the Main Street Play Area is now complete. A new Wicksteed 25m steel cableway (zipwire) and a Galaxy Spring Mobile (springy) have been installed. We hope that the children have many years enjoying this new equipment.

We would like to thank **Winslow and Villages Community Board** for their matched funding as well as the Youth Club (unfortunately now closed) who donated their remaining funds, which paid for the springy.

AGM

The village hall committee held their AGM on Thursday 5th December 2024. It was reported that the village hall finances for the year had been audited and are in a healthy position. It was agreed that charges for the hire of the hall would remain unchanged whilst this is the case.

Election of the village hall committee took place.
