

The church will be suitably decorated for the weekend.




Sincere thanks go to Folly Farm, Adstock, on the main Buckingham Road, for providing two Christmas Trees for St Mary's.



### Who can produce a neighbourhood plan?

Neighbourhood plans have to be initiated by a 'qualifying body', which includes a parish council. This does not mean that Padbury Parish Council has to, or can do, all the work. The view of the parish council is that a neighbourhood plan is a community effort and needs to be produced by the residents of the village. A range of skills is required, for example in drafting surveys, raising funds, report writing, planning law etc. It will not be a simple task and a working group of at least ten people is probably needed so that all the work does not fall on a few people.

### What can you do?

If enough residents show an interest, the parish council will call a meeting to consider how the project can be taken forward.



### What has happened so far?

The first stage of a neighbourhood plan is to designate the area that the plan will apply to. In the case of Padbury the area was designated some time ago to have the same extent as the area within the parish boundary.

At the beginning of the year, the parish council surveyed 19 parishes in the old Aylesbury Vale district council area who had made a neighbourhood plan. Eleven replied and the main conclusions drawn for the responses were:

- The main reason for a neighbourhood plan was to protect against unwanted development.
- A key issue is to establish a settlement boundary, inside the parish boundary in which building can be allowed (provided planning applications are approved).
- The shortest time to make a plan was approx. two years, longest four (but that was affected by covid).
- Generally the plan writing group consisted of residents and councillors, the chairman of which was not always a councillor.
- Most used an external consultant.
- Largest cost was £20,000 but grants are available.
- All reported that it was a worthwhile exercise.

As part of its work on writing a new local plan Buckinghamshire Council made a call for sites. That is, places where someone would like to build houses, subject to obtaining planning permission. Three sites are currently listed for Padbury, which are shown on the map below.

### A NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN FOR PADBURY?

### What is a neighbourhood plan?

Neighbourhood plans were introduced by the Localism Act 2011 (where they are referred to as 'Neighbourhood Development Plans'). In very simple terms a neighbourhood plan is:

- a document setting out planning policies for the neighbourhood area which are, in conjunction with county-wide policies, used to decide planning applications.
- written by the local community, the people who know the area, rather than Buckinghamshire Council.
- a tool to assist the community to get the right type of development, in the right place.

### Main parts of the process

Once a neighbourhood plan has been drafted (which is the larger part of the process) it must be publicised for a period of six weeks for public consultation. Any comments received need to be considered and, if appropriate, amendments made to the draft plan.

The draft plan is then submitted to Buckinghamshire Council, as the local planning authority.

It then undertakes another six week consultation. Any representations received and the draft plan are then submitted for an independent examination. This is to make sure that the proper legal process has been followed and that the plan meets the 'basic conditions' which are that the plan:

- has regard to the National Planning Policy Framework.
- is in general conformity with the strategic policies in Buckinghamshire Council's local plan.
- contributes to the achievement of sustainable development.
- is compatible with human rights requirements.
- is compatible with EU regulations (these are matters that are incorporated into UK law and are generally about the environment).

If necessary, modifications may result from the independent examination to ensure the plan meets legal requirements. Once the examination is 'passed' the plan is then put to a public referendum in the parish. More than 50% of those voting in the referendum need to vote "yes" to bring the plan into force.
