



PADBURY PLAY AREA UPDATE

Following our successful award of a project grant from **Winslow and Villages Community Board**, we have ordered both a Wicksteed 25m steel cableway (zipwire) and a Galaxy Spring Mobile (springy). Match funding was provided by Padbury Parish Council (to match the value of the reward). Donations were also received from the sale of the Padbury Through the Years book and the former youth club. The new equipment should be in place by the Spring. Please note that it is likely that the play area will be closed during the ground preparation and installation phase for Health and Safety reasons.

44TH PADBURY PRODUCE SHOW - REPORT



On the pitch Padbury has had mixed results in the autumn across all its teams. The 1st team has found the Spartan South Midlands league a step up in standard and is consistently being challenged by competitive opponents. With Christmas and New Year fixtures against MK Irish Res (21/12 - H), Pitstone (28/12 - A), and Codicote



(04/01 - A), hopes are high that the festive period will bring some positive results.

Padbury Raptors U15s are well placed in their division of the MKDDL league, following home & away victories against Deanshanger (4-1 and 4-6 respectively). 
