

As this edition of the Pump goes to press, we look forward to welcoming Spring and celebrating the festival of Candlemas. Snowdrops, also called Candlemas Bells, are bravely pushing up through cold soil and coming into bloom. As a village, might this be an indication of what lies ahead.

As you know, Padbury is now without a vicar and it is going to take a great deal of bravery and strength to ensure that the lovely village church is not swallowed up by a greater entity. It will be necessary to 'push hard' to persuade the 'powers that be' in Oxford, that the Lenborough Benefice is alive and well, needing and deserving a new incumbent. You will be kept up-to-date as we move forward but if we are to succeed, we will need help from you all.

Easter is reasonably early this year, falling on 31 March. It's a busy time, starting with:

- a special noonday service on 14 February (which includes a ploughman's lunch),
- Mothering Sunday on 10 March
- Palm Sunday on 24 March,
- the **Agape Supper on 28 March** which re-enacts the Last Supper with delicious, traditional food and worship.

This period of activity all culminates in a **joyful service on Easter Day. The Easter Day service** will start at 9.30am with a family communion. Then there will be bacon, sausage, egg butties, pastries and perhaps a few sweetmeats, and of course, tea, coffee, juice, etc., **could we call it brunch?** Of course there will be an **Easter Egg Hunt** for the children.

COMPLETION OF PADBURY SPORTS PAVILION

The pavilion is now near completion with just the ramp access to be finished. Visitors will notice the large extension with a new kitchen as well as improved toilet and changing room facilities. The old cricket scoreboard hut has now been converted to a referee's room with changing facilities.

The most notable difference is probably the increased head height in the extension to the main/function room which now gives it a more spacious feel. We look forward to it being used again shortly and welcome enquiries regarding its hire. Please contact the Parish Clerk for more information.

MAIN STREET PLAY AREA - THE VOTE IS IN!

Children in the village as well as others attending Padbury CE School and Padbury Preschool were asked to vote for their preferred piece of playground equipment. The children voted overwhelmingly for a new cableway to replace the zipwire.

ALLOTMENT NOTES

I spent a peaceful hour on my allotment on Saturday 20th January, joined by a hopeful robin who followed me as I filled small pots for planting my broad beans. I had to break some ice to get sufficient water to start them off, and then I left them well-covered in my shed. I was hoping to pick some spinach but it had turned to mush with all the recent frosts. It's very bleak and wet on the plots at the moment and we have a lot of winter yet to come, so the ground is not going to dry out anytime soon. The high winds around the new year did some minor distribution of loose stuff, mainly frames, storage containers, bins and netting, but all has now been restored apart from a few compost bin lids. Thanks to **Tracey Kelly** for checking up on the site and keeping people informed.

Two half plots have become vacant and, as there is no waiting list for villagers wanting an allotment, some exciting plans are being formed to make good use of the available ground. One of the plots will be used to plant a mini orchard with low-level hedging around it, and it is hoped that this can be done soon while bare root trees are available. The second piece of ground needs to be completely cleared and then it will be developed as a community plot. Grant funding has been applied for, and if the bid is successful the plot can be fenced and sectioned into small beds. A community allotment offers a way for gardeners to share their skills with like minded people, or to teach people who want to learn about growing food, and it is a rewarding and sociable way to spend time. We will start slowly and engage some experienced and keen volunteers. I will keep plot-holders updated as news becomes available.

Please remember that hedges and vegetation should not obstruct the highway or pavements. The responsibility for maintaining these lies with the property owner.

INCONSIDERATE PARKING

We politely request that drivers be considerate when parking in the village. As well as damaging the grass verges, some drivers are causing an obstruction which is particularly dangerous when this does not allow emergency vehicles to pass.

Inconsiderate parking may also be illegal. Buckinghamshire Council has the right to impose parking tickets and fixed penalty notices where bylaws are in place and the Police have powers dating back from 1847 to prosecute drivers who have committed a criminal offence.

GET A REDUCTION IN YOUR WATER RATES?

You may already know this, but just in case you don't, read on.

Surface water is the rain that drains from the roof of your property and other surfaces, like driveways. It normally flows into a highway drain or a road gulley and then into Anglian Water's sewers. But in some cases the surface water drains into a soakaway in the garden.

If you can show that none of the surface water from your property drains to the public sewerage system, either directly or through intermediate sewers or drains, you can reduce the fixed sewerage charge part of your water rates bill. You will already have this reduction if your water bill shows 'foul only' in the sewage section. An entry of 'foul and surface' means you may be eligible for a reduction.

More details are at https://www.anglianwater.co.uk/account-and-bill/tariffs-and-charges/sewerage-charges/surface-water-drainage/ where there is a form to apply for a reduction. Or just call Anglian Water on **03457 919 155**. Have your account number ready but Anglian Water should be able to find you based on your address.

Success is not guaranteed and it mainly affects newer houses. The reduction could be worth £20-30 for each 6-monthly bill going forward, but if you are eligible the reduction is backdated for 6 years or to the start of your occupation, whichever is the latest. That could be worth something!





Following on from December's tips, here are some more horrific food waste statistics:

- The UK produces the largest amount of food waste in Europe. WRAP [Waste & Resources Action Programme] estimates that 70% of food waste comes from households (6.7 million tonnes), 16% from manufacturers, 12% from hospitality and food services, and 2% from the retail industry
- ullet The average household spends £470 on food that ends up in the bin every year.
- The hospitality and food service sector (including restaurants, hotels, and catering) generates around 920,000 tonnes of food waste annually.

The Government has pledged to ban peat in bagged potting compost "by 2024"

Peatlands are wet, boggy habitats that are hugely important as a carbon store, reduce flood risk, and are home to diverse wildlife. Peatlands store over twice as much carbon as all the world's forests combined, so keeping peat in bogs and not in bags for compost is an essential part of fighting climate change.
