#### UPDATE ON THE SPRINGFIELDS PAVILION DEVELOPMENT

Work has now started on the refurbishment of the pavilion so the facilities may look a little different whilst we are in this period of change. We apologise for any disruption and inconvenience during this time but hope that you can bear with us until we open our new and improved facilities next year.

Gary Bentley of GRB Building Services is the chosen contractor who has successfully bid for the work to extend the pavilion and improve the facilities.

Unfortunately, we have recently been notified that a small number of children have been spotted climbing on to the roof of the cricket hut. 
