## CONSIDERATE PARKING AND AWARENESS OF EMERGENCY VEHICLES

#### **COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH**

By becoming part of the village speedwatch campaign we can share data with Thames Valley Police to help prevent vehicles travelling at excess speeds in Padbury. You would be gathering data with two other volunteers at the roadside as vehicles pass. The Parish Clerk can provide further details if you would like to join.

#### TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES

The Parish Council has recently had a meeting with Buckinghamshire Highways to discuss possible traffic calming measures at the lower end of Main Street. They have suggested some additional road markings with an approximate cost of  $\pounds$ 10,000.

An initial application for funding has been made via the HS<sub>2</sub> Road Safety Fund whilst we look for additional funding sources.


## PADBURY ARTIST EXHIBITING IN WELLS CATHEDRAL




